

COURAGE TO CARE



Parliamentary Recognition Highlights Courage to Care's Vital Work

On September 1st, 2025, the Australian House of Representatives entered a motion to celebrate B'nai B'rith's 80 years of service to Australia. But among all the achievements recognised that day, one program stood out as particularly vital in our current times: *Courage to Care.*

Members praised Courage to Care's transformative work with young Australians, noting the program, which has now reached over 400,000 students across the country, was more crucial than ever in combating rising antisemitism.

Below are the key moments from that historic parliamentary session where Courage to Care's impact was specifically acknowledged and celebrated.

Mr Leeser (Berowra) highlighted the program's origins and current importance:

"The work directly inspired the Courage to Care program, and I want to acknowledge Ernie Friedlander and his great work in that. Launched in Melbourne and then in Sydney, Courage to Care teaches Australians—especially school students—about the dangers of prejudice and discrimination. It empowers them to become upstanders, not bystanders, inspiring young people to embrace and celebrate the beauty of our Jewish tradition, which teaches us to treat others with loving kindness. In a period where antisemitism is escalating, Courage to Care has never been more important."

Mr Burns (Macnamara) emphasized the program's vital message:

"The highlight for me also, I have to mention, just like the member for Berowra, is Courage to Care, which is a program designed, led and fed by B'nai B'rith, which is all about telling young people in Australia that you must be an upstander against racism, not a bystander in witnessing it. That lesson, as the member for Berowra mentioned before, has never been more important."

Ms Spender (Wentworth) shared her personal experience witnessing the program's impact:

"I want to shout out Courage to Care, because that is the organisation and the program that I have seen having the greatest direct impact on students of all faiths in my electorate. I had the enormous privilege of being in one of those programs recently at Rose Bay secondary College... It is remarkable to see that Courage to Care has had that sort of impact on 400,000 students around Australia. That is absolutely critical."




